A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another week full of brilliant learning opportunities in school.

Our Year 2 children enjoyed an exciting visit to Shirebrook Valley, as part of their learning—exploring ‘Who lives in the forest?’,

Jorja from Norfolk, said "Shirebrook Valley was a brilliant trip and it was great to spend time outdoors, not just in the classroom. My favourite part was the squirrel activity."

Jamelia from Endcliffe, said "I loved the trip to Shirebrook Valley. My favourite part was seeing the different areas, especially the pond!"

Following our recent OFSTED inspection, we have put together our key priorities for school improvement work. These priorities will be consistently updated, as we progress throughout the academic year. Our whole staff team are committed to ensuring our children receive the best possible provision, so that ultimately, pupils thrive throughout their time at Birley Spa Primary Academy. Our current key priority foci are;

- Reading - to ensure our pupils develop a ‘love of reading’ across a wide range of books. Ensuring that the systematic teaching of phonics is well embedded in EYFS and beyond so that pupils gain greater phonetical skills and achieve greater scores that are in line with National Averages. In order to achieve this we do need our children to read regularly at home, to enable them to practise and embed their learning.
- Learning environments that support the children’s learning and reflect positive sequences of curriculum that gives opportunities and excellent choices of resource. Having aspirational expectations for positive learning behaviours which are demonstrated by all children.
- To develop our curriculum over the whole school so that children are given numerous opportunities to acquire knowledge progressively. Our priority is providing high quality teaching and learning that allows the children to gain essential knowledge to explore deeper levels of learning and build their knowledge cumulatively year upon year. Our Senior Leaders will be supporting all staff and subject leaders to develop necessary depth of knowledge.

The classroom doors open at 8:45am and close at 8:55am for registration, please ensure you arrive on time to provide your child with their maximum learning potential.

The end of the school day is 3:15pm. Please ensure your child is collected on time, should you be running late please let the school office.

Ensuring your child is in school every day, in order for your child to learn and make connections within their learning they need to be in school. We need you to instil this positive work ethic in the children as it is a behaviour that is expected in school.

Listening to your child read and supporting them with their homework. Reading is the key to all other areas of knowledge and understanding. The love of reading is also so important so please take your child to the library, share audio books, share your own favourite books and encourage them to be interested in vocabulary and word origins.

Give your child the tools to succeed. Develop their resilience and encourage them to learn from their mistakes. Encourage them to find solutions to problems themselves and encourage peaceful problem solving strategies.

Over the next few weeks we will provide you with further information about how we are making the improvements to achieve the vision for Birley Spa to be an outstanding oasis of learning in our community.

Thank you to the parents who are supporting our breakfast club arrangements. If you drop your child off at school and leave them unaccompanied to come onto the premises, or they walk to school with their friends then please do not do this before 8:35am.
