Track and Trace

We have been asked by the Department for Education and Public Health England to provide a track and trace service for the first few days of the Easter holidays. This means that you will need to inform school if your child develops symptoms between Friday 2st April and Monday 4th April and was last in school on Thursday 1st April.

- · Date the symptoms started
- \cdot Date of the positive test

Following a positive test, we will contact anyone your child has been in contact with. Identified contacts will be informed that they have to self-isolate for 10 days.

If your child is a contact, we will get in touch with you via email so please ensure you check your emails regularly during the first week of the holiday period.

We sincerely hope that you all stay healthy and safe and will not need to use this service.

Please note, if a member of your household is waiting for the result of a COVID test, all the members of the household should isolate until the result has been received. Siblings should not be sent to school until a negative result is received.

If pupils are ill or self-isolating and will not be able to return to school at the beginning of the new term, please inform us in the usual way by email or the gateway app by 8.30am on Monday 19th April 2021.

Isolating

Please can we take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers that if your child's pod is closed, due to a positive case, then it is your responsibility to make sure that they stay home at ALL times. This means that they do not leave the household and if they develop symptoms than the whole household needs to isolate and inform school as soon as possible.

They continued to show their fantastic learning behaviours whilst working from home and produced some excellent pieces of work.

Continuing our learning in our topic "How do our bodies move?", in English we have been looking at instruction writing. We began the week by looking at the features of instructions followed by making our own jam sandwiches. The children thoroughly enjoyed doing this, as it enabled them to have real life experiences ready for writing their instructions. By the end of the week children had written some fantastic instructions including all the features needed.

<u>Year 3</u>

In Year 3 we have been reading a picture book called the Tin forest by Helen Ward. The story is about a man who lives in a 'wide windswept place'. Near nowhere and close to forgotten, he lives in a rubbish dump that is filled with things that no one wants'. He builds a forest out of the rubbish (tin) this eventually attracts animals, as the tin forest becomes full of the things everyone wanted - trees, flowers, and animals. Children immersed themselves in the book by creating rainforest pictures and painting in the style of Henri Rousseau. They also created mini–Tin Forests.

In Science we have been looking at flowers and how they pollinate. We even made our own busy bees and dipped them into powder paint to show how the pollen is transferred from one flower to another.

We looked at dissected daffodils and labelled the reproductive parts of the flower


Year 4 - Weston

Year 4 - Kelham

This week Year 4 have been putting our knowledge about writing a recount into practise. We watched a video called "Oktapodi," which is about two octopus' fighting for their lives. The children have done a brilliant job at writing from the perspective of the octopus, using past tense verbs, openers and descriptive language to discuss what had happened to them.

In maths, we have been drawing our own graphs, including bar charts and pictograms. To do this, we first had to collect the data about what everyone's favourite type of fruit was, creating a tally chart to represent this information. Finally, we created some fantastic Easter chicks being hatched from their eggs.

Year 5

In Y5 this week we have been working with 'Learn by Design'. This involves all children taking part in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) workshops. First we looked at the amount of Electricity all the appliances in our homes use, we were very shocked!!! We found that the electric shower used the most electricity, using 10,500 WATTs per second!!! That means a 5 minute shower would cost over £1 on your electricity bill! In the images you can see us replicating our own National Grid and what happens if this grid fails. We looked at renewable and non-renewable energies, we were also surprised that coal would run out in the next 20 years. In contrast to this one rotation of a wind turbine can power your house for two days!



In the next session we are going to be designing our own school of the future, It's going to be so much fun!

Year 6

Year 6 have been researching the effects of pollution on the environment and how to stay fit and healthy with the aim of writing persuasive leaflets; we have utilised emotive language, rhetorical questions, and exaggeration to make our writing as persuasive as possible. Our original stimulus for these pieces of writing was a short film called 'The Ridge' starring Danny Macaskill. In Maths, we have been looking at statistics; tables, timetables, and pie charts. We have learnt how to read and interpret the information within these tables and charts as well as construct tables and charts of our own to represent a unique set of data. In topic, we have learnt so much about our hearts and the blood it pumps around our bodies; we have had a specific focus this term on how to keep our hearts fit and healthy which leads us nicely onto our art project. We have designed and created packaging for a fictional brand-new healthy chocolate bar. Everyone has worked so hard to develop their concepts and bring them to life as a 3D package. Next term, Y6 PE will be on Wednesdays; your child should arrive in school wearing their PE kit.
