New guidance

Please note, close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace. Therefore, education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.

As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case to identify close contacts. Contacts from a setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact. You may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.

From 16 August 2021, children under the age of 18 will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

New appointments

We are delighted to welcome Miss Granger and Mrs Reindhart to our Birley Spa teaching team, from September. As teaching assistants, they will strengthen and support our teaching. Both colleagues are delighted to be joining the Birley Spa team.

September

As of September, all communications will be provided via Showbie and the School Comms gateway app. We will no longer be using Marvellous Me, as we do not wish to confuse parents by employing too many different sources of communication. Over the past year, parents have really complimented our Showbie facility. Therefore, it makes sense to keep this fantastic service as the main point of contact, alongside School Comms Sims alerts. If you have not yet installed these services and apps, or if you are experiencing any technical difficulties with access, please do not hesitate to contact our school office team. They are more than happy to support and assist you with this.

The new academic year will arrive before we know it... May we remind you that pupils will return to school on Thursday 2nd September 2021. As previously stated, we will continue with the current arrangements and times for drop off and collection, at least for the first week. A reminder of drop off and collection times will be sent out before the start of the new term.




Year 3


Year 3 have been continuing the topic on the extreme earth. The children have created non chronological reports which really show how much they have learnt about this topic.



Mrs Roberts and Miss Gostelow would like to thank the children for all their hard work this year and wish the children every success in year 4.


