



This week we have been very excited to watch the final stage in the life cycle of our butterflies. The tiny and very hungry caterpillars have now become butterflies. Today we released them to live in our school garden and watched them fly away to lay more eggs that will hatch into new caterpillars.

Our book of the week this week has been Jack and the Beanstalk. We have been retelling the story with real magic beans and building castles and beanstalks to support our story telling.

We are continuing to develop our environment in EYFS in line with the Curiosity Approach. This week we have been thinking about our cosy areas for reading books. Over the past couple of weeks Key Stage 1 have continued to enjoy their topic "Which animals wriggle, crawl and roam?".

In Science, we have been investigating the different habitats and microhabitats of mini beasts. We have also been looking at the food chain. However, in topic we have been on a journey around the world visiting different continents and exploring the habitats of different animals there. As part of our Art learning, we have been creating observational drawings of mini beasts which we have then used to design a sculpture of a mini beast which we will be creating next week out of clay.

For our English learning, we have been exploring our new book 'Moth' which is an evolutionary story about Moths. From this we taken part in different fact-finding exercises in order to gain as much factual information about Moths as possible. This knowledge will help us when we write our own non-chronological reports next week.

In Y2 Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on fractions by looking at a fraction of a quantity and number. We have also recapped addition and subtraction ready for our KS1 SATs tests that have taken place this week. We would like to take this opportunity to say a big well done to the Year 2 children who have sat their tests this week and have shown great resilience, perseverance and maturity. In Y1 Maths, we have been continuing to look at place value to 100. The children have been using a range of different resources to find 1 more and 1 less than numbers to 100, representing numbers to 100 using pictorial representations and thinking carefully about the placement of numbers, by identifying the tens and ones in each number.

Year 1 and Year 2 are really looking forward to our trip next Thursday 26th May to Yorkshire Wildlife Park. Please give your consent and monies as soon as you can on the School Gateway App. Children need to arrive to school for 8:30am please so we can ensure a prompt departure at 9:00am.




In Y3 we are studying mystery stories. We have immersed ourselves in the story of the Krindlekrax. We have produced some street maps of the mysterious street as part of our immersion work. We are learning to use the different writing effects to create mystery in our writing this week. Such as the main character asking questions and short sentences to show panic.

In Design and Technology we are designing and making healthy sandwiches. We have tasted different breads and thought about the texture, taste and smell before designing a sandwich using an exploded diagram.



It was a fascinating day with the children taking part in a courtroom trial playing different roles, as well as enjoying exhibits and meeting characters relating to British justice from medieval times through to the present day. The children were a credit to themselves and the school, and we were very proud of their behaviour throughout the day. A big thank you to those parents who accompanied us on the trip.

In English we have been learning the skills of writing Narrative this week and will be applying those skills to an independent write next week. In Maths we are looking at Position and Coordinates. PE has been great fun as we've been learning cricket, and in Science we've been observing how sound travels using paper cups and some string!

Year 5

Y5 have had a brilliant term for Summer 1 and have produced and engaged in some great learning.

In English this term, the children have written two balanced arguments weighing up for and against reasons to questions such as: 'Should people consider having a clockwork heart instead of a human heart?' In Maths, we have been recapping fractions practising strategies including: ordering and comparing unit fractions and improper fractions, finding equivalents and working out the lowest common multiple. In History and our journey topic, the children have really enjoyed engaging through discussion based tasks and thinking about how they would feel if they were alive during that time. In Science, we have undertaken Maths experiments to determine how different forces work together and against each other. In Design and Technology, we have made some brilliant bridge structures using basic materials and the children have worked together to discover how to make their pieces stronger.




