

## **EYFS Curiosity Approach**



The team in EYFS are working hard to create an environment for the children which promotes curiosity and provokes children to develop their learning with confidence and wonder. Now we need your help! If you, or any family or friends have any of the items listed that you want to rehome, we would be very grateful for any donations. These can be taken to the school office or to the EYFS base. Many thanks to those who have already helped us with our collections.

#### **Natural materials**

We use cones, sticks, shells and stones for counting and pattern making so please encourage your child to make collections to bring into school. We can also use more or less anything made from wood or other natural materials eg curtain rings,











#### **Cushions**, Throws and Rugs

We are looking for rugs or cushions that will enhance our cosy areas. We also need any pieces of fabriceither plain or patterned but preferably muted colours rather than bright colours.





#### Pots, Pans and kitchen utensils

We are redesigning our role play areas and playdough areas so we only use real authentic resources. We can use any dishes, plates, bowls, spoons, jugs or teapots made out of wood or metal. We would **really** like to find some old style telephones!









#### **Baskets and boxes**

We would like to collect natural baskets and wooden boxes to store resources so that children can access them independently when they need them







## Cable reels and strong tubes

Class Round-Up

**EYFS** 

FS1 & 2





In EYFS last week we have been Explorers! Our exploration last week sent us into space. We have turned our role play areas into a space theme and we have been building space ships from the blocks. We have made them from cardboard boxes too, just like Baby Bear in our story 'Whatever Next?' by Jill Murphy. We have been learning all about Neil Armstrong, who landed on the moon, as well as Helen Sharman, who went to Space and came from our home town of Sheffield. We will be finding out more about the planets and using our imagination to describe aliens.

The exciting news in EYFS is that a tiny wren has made it's nest in the outdoor pavilion in Whirlow garden. We have been watching the mother bird feeding the babies in the nest and finding out more about wrens by searching the internet.

What a wonderful year of learning in EYFS have had. We are so proud of every one of the children!

So far this half term, KS1 have thoroughly been enjoying their learning around our topic 'Why Do Boats Float?'.

In our wider curriculum work, we have been learning all about famous pirates and their jobs. We have researched Grace O'Malley, William Kidd, Captain Blackbeard and Anne Bonney. We began by fact finding all about them and we are now creating our own non-chronological reports all about the famous pirates.

For maths, year 1 have been learning about money, using their existing knowledge of counting in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's to find a total amount in both pence and pounds. We have now moved onto the division and multiplication. However, year 2 have been looking at addition and subtraction as well. We have been focusing on fact families along with the link between number bonds to 10 and number bonds to 100.

In our English lessons, we have thoroughly enjoyed our first story 'The Pirate Cruncher' in which Captain Purplebeard and his crew are greeted by an old fiddler who sings them a song all about treasure on an island, but he does warn them about the monster! The greedy pirates set sail across the sea to find the treasure however are suddenly eaten by a monster! Year 1 and year 2 have enjoyed putting themselves into the shoes of one of the pirates and writing a diary entry all about the journey. We even made up our own pirate names! This week we have moved onto our new story 'The Secret of Black Rock' where we have been immersed into the book.

It was a pleasure to take the children on an educational visit to Birley Spa View Church on Thursday 23rd June in which we explored the church and the different things that happen there. This linked to our current RE topic where we are looking at different religious places of worship. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Chris Jeavons and his team for making this such a great experience. The children thoroughly enjoyed their time and showed impeccable behaviour!





Year 3 are really looking forward to the Summer fayre and making our products to sell. We have been creating some decorated rocks and some keychains so please come and support us tomorrow.


Another well done from the year 4 team to all the children who completed their end of year assessments last week; they approached them with the maturity and resilience we have come to expect from our children.


