Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> & Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October 10:30am – 11:30am & 1:30pm – 2:30pm

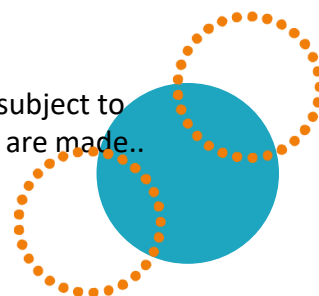
Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November – 3:30pm – 5:00pm

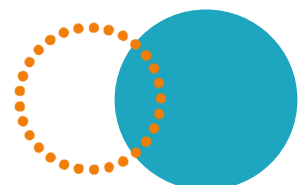
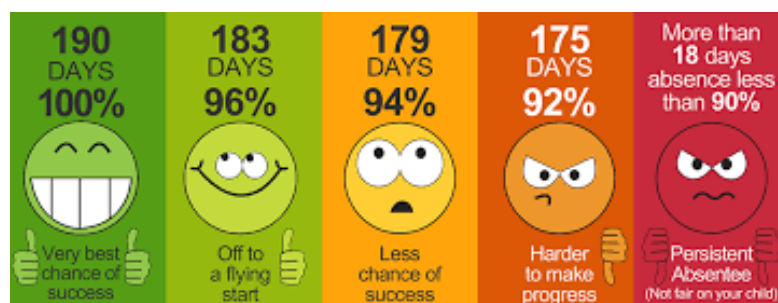
