National story telling week:

We're so excited for the upcoming National Storytelling Week which runs from 28th January to 5th February! Sharing stories with a child is one of the most exciting, rewarding things we can do so we plan to really celebrate stories during this week. We really want to promote reading for pleasure as well as reading to learn so we have a range of opportunities planned over the week.

- Teachers will read a story to a class they don't normally teach.
- Children will pair up with others from a different year group to share a story.
- Children will bring in their favourite book to share with a friend.
- Each class will read stories set in other cultures or

written in another language alongside English to see the universal power of storytelling.

- There will be a story writing competition for children to enter with a **£50 book token** for the best story from each Key Stage and a **£20 book token** for the runner up in each Key Stage. The stories will be judged by the CREATE Collaborate pupil voice group.

There will be other storytelling opportunities for children throughout the week, chosen by the children.

If any of our families have any stories that are written in other languages or represent a country that is special to them, we would be keen to see/hear them so please let us know.

We would love to welcome parents in to school to read with a class or group of children – please let the office staff know if you would be prepared to give 15-30 minutes of your time during this week to make a huge difference to our children.

World Book Day:

For the upcoming World Book day on 2nd March, children are welcome to wear bought costumes, however, to keep costs to a minimum we would love to see as many as possible home made costumes. The learning during the day will be based around different books.

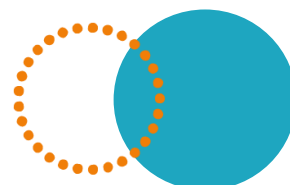
