

Was the Anglo-Saxon period really a Dark Age?

Year 4 – Miss Gostelow and Miss Morley

In this unit, the children will learn about the world of the Anglo-Saxons. They will consider why they came to Britain and whether the period deserves to be called the 'Dark Ages'. Throughout the unit, there is a strong focus on the range of sources that provide us with evidence about the people living at that time. The children will examine archaeological evidence, such as the Sutton Hoo ship burial and the Staffordshire hoard, while using written evidence from the time, including Beowulf, to provide context for the archaeological finds. They will learn about the importance of archaeological evidence and the work of the archaeologist, as well as the accidental finds of metal detectorists.

This term's class text is Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo. The children will be using this text to write a narrative. Within their writing, they will be looking to use grammatical features such as subordinating clauses, leading into complex sentences.



Within Maths, the class will begin by looking at place value then move on to addition and subtraction while finishing with money and time.
